



## Extended Abstracts Guidelines

Extended abstracts of a maximum of 1,000 words should be sent in Microsoft Word format or saved as .rtf or .doc files, double-spaced.

After the title of the paper, include the following information:

**Author name(s)**, affiliations, complete mailing address, contact e-mail address for the corresponding author.

**Citations of other works** may be included in extended abstracts. Format for call-outs in text is as follows:

1 author (Smith, 2008)

2 authors (Smith and Jones, 2008)

3 or more authors (Smith et al., 2008)

Multiple citations by author(s) (Smith, 1999, 2008)

Multiple citations, various authors (Smith, 2008; Smith and Jones, 1999, 2008)

**References** follow the text. Generally, use the following format (note punctuation):

*From a journal:*

Last name, initials (no spaces), Title of article: Journal, v. 000, p. 000–000.

*From a book:*

Last name, initials (no spaces), Title of article, *in* editor's name, title of book: city, state or province, country, publisher, p. 000–000.

### Examples:

Symons, D.T.A., Paleomagnetism of the HYC Zn-Pb sedex deposit, Australia: Evidence of an epigenetic origin: *Economic Geology*, v. 102, p. 1295–1310.

Ohmoto, H., and Rye, R.O., 1979, Isotopes of sulfur and carbon, *in* Barnes, H.L., ed., *Geochemistry of hydrothermal ore deposits*, 2<sup>nd</sup> ed., New York, Wiley, p. 509–567.

**Figure captions** follow references. Number them, Fig. 1, Fig. 2, etc.

**Graphics:** Graphics should be in the original format (Illustrator, CorelDraw) and saved in a compatible format such as pdf or eps. Include scale bars, north arrows, as appropriate. If using shades of gray, be sure they are easily distinguished. Photos should be originally imaged at 300 dpi. If hard copy must be scanned, 1200 dpi will produce best copy. Several graphics in one figure should be labeled with letters—A, B, C. Please make sure your pdf or eps graphic retains details of the original. It's best to take scanned graphics into a vector program before adding text, to avoid pixilation of text.
